And it is wise for us to remember that the Lord created the world with exquisite balances, to keep it healthy and sustained. It is we, as humans, who have been called to safeguard it. It is we, as Franciscans, who are called to be in universal kinship with it and invite others to do the same.

The San Diego Union-Tribune, our local newspaper, ran an article by Greg Moran on June 27 reminding us of the importance of trees. He said and I quote,

Summer has just arrived and already temperatures are soaring as residents prepare for the inevitable "July Fry." At least we have one tool to fight the warming climate — trees, which provide shade, soak up carbon and can reduce heat-related illnesses like heat stroke and heat exhaustion.

Our Care for Creation Team for the Diocese of San Diego is sponsoring a tree planting in September. I personally have learned that it requires some special love and care to plant and grow a tree but there are resources available to teach those of us who want to endeavor on this project to do so. Perhaps your Franciscan fraternity would want to consider taking on such a project. Let us continue to pray for our earth and all that is within it.
