I am sending you my monthly letter on September 1, the day our Beloved Church calls for a World Day of Prayer for Care for Creation. Our attention is also called to Afghanistan and all those in the world who are leaving their ancestral homes to find safety. At the end of 2020, the United National estimated that 82 million people were forcibly displaced from their homes due to persecution, violence, conflict, or other events that disturbed the public order, including climate disruption. Our Catholic scientists have alerted us to continuing migration worldwide from climate chaos that renders certain parts of the world uninhabitable. The areas are increasing. These "climate refugees" will add to the already burgeoning figures.

Therefore, as we hold our Sister, Mother Earth, in our prayers today, let us pray for people fleeing from Afghanistan and other areas of the world, and keep our reflections upon the future of migration due to climate.
