Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ and in St. Francis,

I am not sure how our Bible scholars interpret this interchange, but I heard the Lord asking me, where are your brothers, and sisters, and all members of the human family. I, says the Lord, created all. He calls us to care for all in our human family.

So, sisters and brothers, as we move through this final part of 2022 and begin 2023, let us be mindful of all within the human family and strive to be the beneficial presence to all that God is calling us to be. May we embrace God's love and carry it into the world, as He has asked us to do. May we walk together as Franciscans, dedicated to God and following our Rule of Live given to us by our Saint. May we remember, when God sees a person in pain or trouble, may He see a Franciscan there to help.
