Finally, in week five I will seek God's guidance on how to serve Him as a worthy witness and energetic servant as we move through this year.

I invite you, sisters and brothers, to join me on this journey. May we open our eyes to the beauty of all of creation. May we awaken and nurture in our hearts awareness of the sacredness in all things. May we attune our ears to hear the cry of the earth. May we join our collective Franciscan voices to pray for our earth and all of creation. May we join our compassionate actions to others around the world and do our part to safeguard and protect our Common Home. May we remember the words of the prophet Amos who inspired the title of this year's Season of Creation, "Let justice flow on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream" (5:24).
